**Meet Wormwood's Newest "Patient":
Stephen Kumalo**

The Screwtape Letters, by C.S. Lewis, provides readers with a glimpse into how Satan tries to undermine mankind into thinking and acting his way. Through the writings of Screwtape to his nephew Wormwood the reader is allowed to see that Satan's schemes are a lot more subtle than most would suspect.

Alan Paton's classic novel, *Cry, the Beloved Country*, portrays the story of the tragedy and triumph of the Reverend Stephen Kumalo. Throughout his trials and tribulations, Kumalo proves to be a man of great faith and conviction.

In this assignment you will be taking on the role of Screwtape. You have decided that you have a new "patient" for your nephew Wormwood. His mission is to try to win over the soul of Kumalo for hell. Based on your reading of both stories, what methods can you use that might be effective where Kumalo is concerned? How might you be able to get him to turn his back on his God?

Assignment

On a **Word document** complete the following:

- ✓ You will be writing a series of **THREE letters from Screwtape to Wormwood**, each in correct letter format and three-quarters of a page long, excluding the salutation and closing.
- ✓ Each letter should focus on one particular method suggested by Screwtape in *The Screwtape Letters* to be used to make Kumalo turn away from his faith.
- ✓ Each letter should make specific references as to why the chosen method of Screwtape might work on Kumalo based on what he is going through in *Cry, the Beloved Country*.
- ✓ Each letter should be written in the same format as Screwtape's letters to Wormwood in *The Screwtape Letters*.
