



Dear SCA Community,

Another brief follow-up related to the preschool case and other cases to keep everyone informed. This may not directly relate to you or your family, but to keep you informed below are the key points. These relate only to cases of SCA students, faculty, or staff, we have been very blessed to keep these to a minimum and appreciate your help to reduce your exposure outside of SCA.

- Pre-K and Preschool Teacher case:
 - The Preschool and PreK remain on quarantine due to the two positive cases with the instructors.
 - The elementary specials teacher which we previously notified you about who tested positive (related to the preschool case) has since taken a full PCR test and **tested negative**. While this is great news, her and those already notified as being exposed will need to complete their quarantine.
 - One of the Preschool students who has been quarantined did test positive. We are asking the elementary siblings of all Preschool and PreK students to also quarantine for this same period due to the difficulty to isolate young children.
- Kindergarten Student:
 - A kindergarten parent who tested positive reported to us that their child tested positive as well. The family (including a member of our office staff) was already on quarantine since this past weekend and will continue. MCDHS is NOT recommending or requiring quarantine for this Kindergarten class due to the timeline and exposure.
- Middle School: There NOT currently any middle school students or teachers on campus who are positive.
- High School:
 - We have a single high school student at this time who along with others was on quarantine for exposure related to a youth group they attended. While on quarantine this student has since tested positive and is completing quarantine.

When we are notified of anyone “exposed” outside of SCA, they are quarantined based on our protocols and guidance from MCDHS. We apologize for the repetitive nature of some of the information but wish to keep you informed. We are working to keep these emails more succinct, so please refer to previous emails for details on keeping your children home for any illness, and ways to reduce exposure.

Our safety protocols, health procedures, and mask requirements will continue to be in place. Thank you for continuing to support the safety of our campus by reducing exposure outside of your home to the extent possible and supporting the protocols we have in place. Even in these challenging times, and perhaps especially in these challenging times, we are so blessed to be a part of this amazing community of Christ-followers, united in spirit. May God continue to bless you and your families!
